What is the Labor Summer Fellowship?

Labor Summer is an 8-week fellowship that connects San Diego and Imperial Valley students with local labor organizations to champion worker justice. In partnership with host organizations, fellows train to become the next generation of labor organizers, researchers, and leaders—building a powerful "School to Movement" pipeline that launches students into careers in social justice and the labor movement in our communities.

TIMELINE

OPENING RETREAT

Three-day opening retreat that trains fellows as organizers, connects fellows across unions, and orients them to the labor movement.

SUMMER PLACEMENT

Eight week fellowship with a host organization and placement with a mentor. 40/hr per week, on the ground experience to train students in organizing, research, communications, or policy.

CLOSING RETREAT

Two-day closing retreat that serves as the School to Movement pipeline. Critical orientation to the region of San Diego and Imperial County, careers in the labor movement, and survival strategies for the long haul as organizers.
